Dear Kindergarten Parents,

The LETTER AND SOUND IDENTIFICATION ASSESSMENT provides information about a child's ability to name each upper and lower case letter and to give the sound for each letter. It is one task that provides evidence of the child's early literacy by identifying which letters and sounds a child can identify.

### **English Language Arts *Most Essential Benchmark:***

**A3-1 *Develop awareness of concepts of print as an aid to understanding*** (e.g., illustration, directionality, punctuation, title, sense of letter, word spaces, and sentence).

In kindergarten students learn to identify the letters of the alphabet, the sounds the letters make, and words that begin with the letters.

Listed on the next four pages are the upper and lower case letters, including a book style, "a" and "g". Kindergarten children in Kenosha Unified elementary schools should know all of the letters and sounds by the end of kindergarten. Kindergarten teachers assess their students throughout the year to see if they can identify these letters and their sounds.

Parents are encouraged to practice the letters and sounds with their kindergarten children.

The letters may be cut apart and used as flash cards for practicing with your child.

Enjoy the time with your child as you practice the letters and sounds together.
