SAY SOMETHING

Warning signs to look for:

- Feeling rejected or appearing withdrawn
- Having been a victim of bullying/violence
- Making threats of violence or being overly aggressive
- Talking about access to weapons in a threatening manner
- Having anger issues
- Expressing violence in drawings or writings
- Fighting frequently
- Showing cruelty toward pets and animals
- Being prejudiced or intolerant of differences
- Watching a lot of violent television programs
- Playing violent videogames regularly
- Using drugs or alcohol
- Participating in a gang

If you hear or see someone exhibiting these behaviors, please notify a parent, teacher, principal, counselor, police officer or any other trusted adult. Your sharing could save the lives of others. If you see or hear something, say something!

Wisconsin's Act 311 generally states that any individual who makes real or false claims regarding shootings, bomb threats or to cause any other bodily harm to others is guilty of a Class I felony. Any form of threat against the school, staff or students will be taken seriously and disciplinary action will be imposed if someone is guilty of such threats.
