# What is Title I ?

- Title I is a federal grant program designed to give educational assistance to students living in areas of high poverty.
- The Title I program originated in 1965 when Congress passed the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, and was reauthorized in 2001 with the passage of the No Child Left Behind Act.
- Title I is one of the oldest and largest federal programs supporting elementary and secondary education in existence, and over 90% of the school systems in the United States receive some sort of Title I funding.
- The Title I program provides financial assistance through State educational agencies (SEAs) to local educational agencies (LEAs) and public schools with high numbers or percentages of poor children to help ensure that all children meet challenging State academic content and student academic achievement standards.

# Bose Title I Team

- Made up of teachers, support staff, administration and parents
- Team meets to analyze school data to determine the needs assessment
- Goals are set for the academic year
- Budget is determined to support the goals
- Goals and budget are shared with the school community
- Mid-year review is conducted in January to assess progress towards goals and review budget

# Literacy Goal

- By the end of 2018-19 school year 50% of students in grades 2 - 5 will meet their projected RIT growth in Reading as measured by NWEA-MAP.
- By the end of the 2018-2019 school year, 52% of Bose students identified as Black will meet their projected RIT score growth as measured by NWEA-MAP assessments in Reading.

# Numeracy Goal

- By the end of the 2018-19 school year 55% of students in grades 2 -5 will meet their projected RIT growth in Math as measured by NWEA-MAP.
- By the end of the 2018-19 school year 58% of students identified as Black in grades 2 - 5 will meet their projected RIT growth in Math as measured by NWEA-MAP.
