KUSD GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

District policy states that seniors must have all graduation requirements completed by the last day of school senior year in order to take part in the graduation ceremony. Seniors that do not meet graduation requirements will NOT be eligible to attend the graduation ceremony and will need to attend summer school.

All seniors are required to take a minimum of 5.0 credits, regardless of graduation status.

Elective credits are any credits not covered in the areas listed above or additional credits beyond what is required in each subject area. For example, a fourth science credit would be an elective credit.
