# KUSD GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

District policy states that seniors must have all graduation requirements completed by the last day of school senior year in order to take part in the graduation ceremony. Seniors that do not meet graduation requirements will NOT be eligible to attend the graduation ceremony and will need to attend summer school.

**All seniors are required to take a minimum of 5.0 credits, regardless of graduation status.**

<b>English</b> – Survey Literature – 1.0 credit – World Literature – 1.0 credit – American Literature or AP Language – 1.0 credit – Perspectives in Literature or AP Literature – 1.0 credit	4.0
<b>Math</b> <i>Varies based on the student's math pathway. Typically:</i> – Algebra 1 – 1.0 credit – Geometry – 1.0 credit – Algebra 2 – 1.0 credit	3.0
<b>Social Studies</b> – World History – 1.0 credit – US History – 1.0 credit – US Government & Politics – 0.5 credit – Social Science Seminar (must pass full year) – 0.5 credit	3.0
<b>Science</b> – Accelerated Biology – 1.0 credit – Accelerated Chemistry – 1.0 credit – Human Anatomy & Physiology – 1.0 credit	3.0
<b>Physical Education</b>	1.5
<b>Health</b>	0.5
<b>Consumer Education</b> – Economics – 0.5 credit	0.5
<b>Elective Courses</b> *Each semester course = .5 credit	8.0
<b>Minimum Credits Required for Graduation</b>	23.5
<b>Other Requirements for Graduation</b> – Civics Exam (65% or higher) – 10 hours of community service (100+ hours will receive a service distinction)	(These requirements are non-credit bearing)

The credits required for graduation (23.5) is a minimum number. Many students will exceed this amount.

Elective credits are any credits not covered in the areas listed above or additional credits beyond what is required in each subject area. For example, a fourth science credit would be an elective credit.
