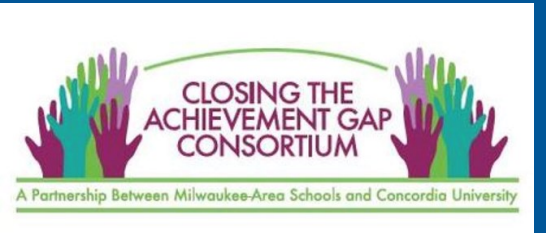


Concordia University and Closing the Achievement Gap Consortium (CAGC) Present:
2018–2019 Minority Teaching Scholarship



WHO: Students of color from a CAGC High School interested in the field of Education. Scholarship winners must agree to teach at a CAGC school for at least 3 years following college. Students must have a minimum GPA of 2.5 to apply, and meet CUW’s entrance requirements.

WHERE: Students must attend Concordia University Wisconsin and agree to be a School of Education student.

WHAT: \$2,000 annual award good for up to 4 years; for a total of \$8,000

2018-2019 CAGC MINORITY SCHOLARSHIP

Process, Procedures & Criteria

CUW Guidelines

- The CAGC scholarships are for attendance at Concordia University Wisconsin
- The CAGC scholarship program will begin with the Fall undergraduate class of 2015
- All scholarship recipients are to be School of Education enrollees who are planning to complete the teacher licensing program at CUW
- The CAGC scholarship program is a four year program where involved students must be a full time student, maintain a minimum of a 2.5 GPA and remain in the School of Education in order for the scholarship to be renewable for the ensuing school year
- Any recipient who does not remain in good academic standing and adhere to rules and regulations at Concordia will lose the CAGC scholarship
- All CAGC Scholarship recipients are to be students of color from the CAGC high schools

CAGC Scholarship Expectations

- Each high school in the CAGC will receive at least one \$2000.00 annual student of color scholarship for undergraduate School of Education majors.
- Each high school will select their own recipient(s) of the scholarship and set their own criteria. Except, each scholarship recipient must agree to be a School of Education student at Concordia, each scholarship recipient must agree to teach in a CAGC school district for at least three years or return the scholarship funds, only students who maintain at least a 2.5 high school GPA and are minority students will be considered for this scholarship, students must meet Concordia entrance requirements
- High schools shall establish their criteria, share the criteria with CUW and meet minimum high school GPA of 2.5. It is suggested that participating CAGC high schools set an ACT composite minimum of 20 for the scholarship
- Each high school should submit their scholarship nominees by February 28, 2018.

2018-2019 CAGC MINORITY SCHOLARSHIP

Process, Procedures & Criteria

- Each high school shall announce the recipient of the scholarship at an annual awards ceremony
- Each high school awarding a scholarship will invite a Concordia representative to issue the scholarship at an award ceremony.
- A requirement of the scholarship is that recipients agree to return to one of the CAGC school districts as a professional employee upon graduation from Concordia
