WHAT IS HEAD START?

Head Start is a free federal program providing a variety of educational, health, nutritional and family services to preschool children and their families. Special education services are available for identified children. Parent involvement is strongly encouraged at Head Start.

WHO PARTICIPATES?

All children whose families meet eligibility requirements may attend Head Start. Children must be 3 or 4 by Sept. 1.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD LEARN TO DO?

- Identify colors, numbers and letters
- Write their name and use scissors
- Eat healthy, exercise and brush teeth
- Solve problems, get along with others and share
- Understand transitions and routines
- Improve listening and speaking skills
- Develop an enjoyment of books

FREE FEDERAL PRESCHOOL PROGRAM FOR 3- AND 4-YEAR-OLD CHILDREN



PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY:

- Family income must be within approved federal guidelines
- Children must have a physical and dental exam within 90 days of enrollment
- Verification of immunizations or immunization waiver must be provided
- Original birth certificate must be provided
