# Survey Process and Methodology

- Survey window: September 25 - October 11, 2024
- Purpose: evaluate the district's needs, consider possible solutions, and contribute feedback to guide next steps.

# Survey Process and Methodology



## All Respondents Group

- 4,273 respondents completed the survey

## Comparison Group

- Community members who are not current parents of preschool or school-aged students, employees, or students.
- 829 respondents, or approx. 19.4% of the total

## Weighted Group

- 70% weight to non-affiliated community members (Comparison Group)
- 30% weight to affiliated community members (parents of preschool or school-aged children, employees, students)

# Survey Process and Methodology

- The following data points are not based on a scientific sample.
- Because we used a convenience sample, it would be methodologically inappropriate to conduct regression analysis or attempt to calculate error.

<b>Combined strongly agree/agree</b>	<b>61.44%</b>	<b>48.86%</b>

# Survey Question 11

**How familiar are you with the Kenosha Unified School District's budget challenges and the process the School Board is using to find solutions?**

	<b>All</b>	<b>Comparison</b>
I am very familiar	86.25%	33.90%
I am somewhat familiar	45.71%	52.71%
I have no familiarity	18.04%	13.39%
<b>Combined very/somewhat</b>	<b>81.96%</b>	<b>86.61%</b>

# Survey Question 12

I believe the school district's most urgent financial needs must be addressed now.

	<u>All</u>	<u>Comparison</u>	<u>Weighted</u>
Strongly agree	44.79%	37.39%	39.86%
Agree	38.64%	35.59%	36.71%
Disagree	10.70%	16.77%	14.70%
Strongly Disagree	5.87%	10.25%	8.74%
<b>Combined strongly agree/agree</b>	<b>83.43%</b>	<b>72.98%</b>	<b>76.57%</b>



# Survey Question 13

How likely are you to support an operational referendum on the February 2025 ballot?

	<u>All</u>	<u>Comparison</u>	<u>Weighted</u>
I would <b>definitely</b> support	37.30%	30.16%	32.53%
I would <b>probably</b> support	32.74%	21.47%	25.33%
I would <b>probably not</b> support	14.28%	19.06%	17.46%
I would <b>definitely not</b> support	15.68%	29.31%	24.68%
<b>Combined definitely/probably</b>	<b>70.04%</b>	<b>51.57%</b>	<b>57.86%</b>

# Survey Question 14

SCENARIO #1: I would vote “yes” on a referendum question to increase the revenue limit by roughly \$19 million a year to address KUSD’s budget deficit, retain staff, and maintain student programming if there was to be an estimated annual tax increase of \$261 on each \$250,000 of equalized property value.

	<u>All</u>	<u>Comparison</u>	<u>Weighted</u>
I would <b>definitely</b> support	37.16%	27.99%	31.06%
I would <b>probably</b> support	24.01%	18.58%	20.45%
<b>I am not sure</b> if I would support it	15.66%	13.15%	13.99%
I would <b>probably not</b> support	6.69%	10.13%	8.97%
I would <b>definitely not</b> support	16.48%	30.16%	25.53%
<b>Combined definitely/probably</b>	<b>61.17%</b>	<b>46.57%</b>	<b>51.51%</b>

# Survey Question 15

SCENARIO #2: I would vote “yes” on a referendum question to increase the revenue limit by roughly \$28 million a year to address KUSD’s budget deficit, retain and recruit staff, maintain student programming, add course offerings, and increase teacher professional time if there was to be an estimated annual tax increase of \$394 on each \$250,000 of equalized property value.

	<u>All</u>	<u>Comparison</u>	<u>Weighted</u>
I would <b>definitely</b> support	25.30%	18.82%	21.00%
I would <b>probably</b> support	20.81%	12.55%	15.30%
<b>I am not sure</b> if I would support it	20.41%	16.41%	17.73%
I would <b>probably not</b> support	11.02%	12.79%	12.21%
I would <b>definitely not</b> support	22.47%	39.45%	33.77%
<b>Combined definitely/probably</b>	<b>46.11%</b>	<b>31.37%</b>	<b>36.30%</b>

# Survey Question 16

SCENARIO #3: I would vote “yes” on a referendum question to increase the revenue limit by roughly \$34 million a year to address KUSD’s budget deficit, retain and recruit staff, maintain student programming, add course offerings, increase teacher professional time, and add security personnel if there was to be an estimated annual tax increase of \$482 on each \$250,000 of equalized property value.

	<u>All</u>	<u>Comparison</u>	<u>Weighted</u>
I would <b>definitely</b> support	20.15%	14.84%	16.61%
I would <b>probably</b> support	14.53%	7.72%	10.08%
<b>I am not sure</b> if I would support it	22.16%	15.68%	17.78%
I would <b>probably not</b> support	14.42%	13.03%	13.48%
I would <b>definitely not</b> support	28.74%	48.73%	42.05%
<b>Combined definitely/probably</b>	<b>34.68%</b>	<b>22.56%</b>	<b>26.69%</b>

  - Board discussion/possible action on referendum resolution
