

Safety Plans within an IEP

Students that have a disability that effects vision, mobility, cognition, behavior, hearing, and/or other health concerns may have Safety Concerns that need to be documented in the IEP.

AREAS OF SAFETY TO CONSIDER:

- Breakfast Program, Lunch, Snacks supervision, choking hazards, severe allergies, use of special equipment, procedures -with or without special training
- Use of Bathroom supervision, use of special equipment (i.e. Hoyer lift), number of personnel needed, procedures with or without special training
- Before School/Recess/After School/ Extra-Curricular Activities supervision
- Passing Between Classrooms supervision, extra time, early/late dismissal, use of special equipment, physical assistance for mobility and/or carrying supplies, procedures – with or without special training
- Field Trips supervision, placement in group with a staff member, special equipment needed
- Evacuation supervision/assistance for exiting the building safely or getting to a designated safe area
- Tornado/Safety supervision/assistance for getting to a designated safe area

This information is documented in the IEP under Supplementary Aids and Services.
