INSTRUCTIONA

Instructional swim program offers three separate sessions for children ages 6–14 (must be 6 yrs. old on or before 8/31/25). Levels 1-6 Red Cross training classes available.

The Advance Swimming option is open to competitive swimmers in skill levels 4, 5 and 6 only. Individuals signing up for Advance Swimming must be able to swim independently for two full lengths of the swimming pool using two different competitive swim strokes. If your child is unable to meet these requirements, they will not be able to attend this class period. If eligible for the Advanced Swim Sessions, they may sign up for as many sessions as they like.
