PURPOSE

Kenosha Unified School District (KUSD) is requesting information from possible providers for the collaboration of the 4-year-old kindergarten program 4K Community Approach (4KCA) in the fall of 2026. A 4-year-old is defined as being 4 years old on or before September 1, 2026. Providers must be willing to allow a KUSD teacher to work in their facility for 4 hours per day, four days each week, at the provider's location, beginning August 25, 2026, and continuing through June 12, 2027. If the provider currently employs a DPI certified teacher, KUSD will consider hiring this individual, as a KUSD employee, for the 4K classroom. Provider should also be able to provide administrative and janitorial support for the KUSD teacher. Awards may be given to numerous providers. This will be a one-year contract renewable annually upon the mutual agreement of the Early Education committee and the provider. Interested providers must hold a State of Wisconsin group day care provider's license. KUSD requires this program to be operational on the first day of school for KUSD 4KCA children.

The Early Education Committee will review responses to this request and evaluate them based on successfully answering all questions asked on the vendor checklist page. After the review/evaluation process occurs, those providers that can agree to the criteria will be recommended to the KUSD Administration as a qualified 4K Community Approach for next year.

Participants of the 4KCA program will receive a minimum of \$350 per child based on the number of 4-year-old children being served in collaboration with KUSD on September 20, 2026 and \$350 per child based on the number of 4-year-old children being served in collaboration with KUSD on January 10, 2027. Please note that the minimum number of children in each classroom is 13 and the maximum is 20. KUSD reserves the right to evaluate the inventory of classroom supplies and assist with securing appropriate equipment.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Objectives

The purpose of this service is to support the social/emotional, physical, cognitive and language development of four old children that are enrolled in the Early Education 4K Collaborative Approach Program. KUSD, in concert with the successful bidder(s), will establish a classroom comprised of KUSD Early Education children housed at the bidder's facility. This will be accomplished through a mutual partnership in the planning and implementation of services. The successful bidder(s) recognize the need to collaborate to promote quality early education and care for children within the Kenosha Community.

Scope and Activities

1. Responsibilities of the successful bidder(s):
 - Provide a classroom with the state required square footage to house 13-20 children
 - Provide center staff to maintain the state required student-teacher ratio (providing an assistant when there are over 13 children in the classroom)
 - Provide materials for classroom use

- Provide snacks and meals to those who participate in the classroom
 - Provide wrap-around care to meet the needs of the families
 - Provide internet access available to the teacher for the purpose of daily attendance and curriculum support
 - Support the implementation of the Creative Curriculum with the Early Education classroom
 - Support teacher staff development and classroom preparation on Friday mornings.
 - Attend Director meetings
 - Inform KUSD of any changes in licensing status within five (5) business days of the occurrence
 - Inform KUSD of any changes with the insurance policy covering the program within five (5) business days of the occurrence
 - Provide administrative and janitorial support
2. Responsibilities of Kenosha Unified School District:
- Provide a DPI certified teacher for the classroom
 - Provide substitute teachers for the classroom as needed
 - Provide materials and equipment to support quality instruction
 - Reimburse successful bidder(s) \$350.00 per child for children enrolled in the Early Education classroom on the September Third Friday count day and the January second Friday count day. Reimbursement to occur within thirty (30) business days from the date that the student count is finalized.
 - Provide weekly staff development for the Early Education teacher. Occasionally Professional Learning opportunities will be offered and child care center staff may be invited to attend as permitted by the center.
3. Supervision of the 4K classroom will be shared collaboratively between the successful bidder(s) on site staff and KUSD staff
4. All families enrolled in the collaborative room will be offered the opportunity to participate in both agencies activities.
5. This collaboration will be for the duration of the 2026-2027 school year.
6. Both parties will respect the clients' right to privacy and will deliver services that are child-centered, family-centered and community-based

BACKGROUND

The Kenosha Unified School District is the third largest school district in the state, employing over 4,000 individuals and educating approximately 19,000 students. It is located in Kenosha County, Wisconsin and serves the City of Kenosha, Village of Pleasant Prairie, and the Town and Village of Somers. The District contains 32 schools including 17 elementary schools, 4 middle schools, 3 high schools, and 8 charter/choice/specialty schools.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. General conditions printed on prior page(s) will apply.
2. By submitting a proposal, the respondent hereby asserts that they have read the Request for Proposal document and that they are thoroughly informed of and familiar with the contents and requirements.
3. The Kenosha Unified School District (KUSD) reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids/proposals, to waive any informality or technicality in any bid/proposal submitted, and to accept any part of a bid/proposal deemed to be in the best interest of KUSD. KUSD reserves the right to negotiate with any company after the bid opening has occurred. The Request for Proposal does not guarantee a purchase will be made.
4. Service start date will be at the request of KUSD.
5. Written responses must be submitted in a sealed envelope marked “**#5391 – EARLY EDUCATION 4K COMMUNITY APPROACH PROGRAM.**” They are to be returned to Kenosha Unified School District, 3600-52nd Street, Kenosha, Wisconsin 53144, Purchasing Department, no later than **Wednesday, March 18, 2026 at 10:00AM**. Please include the entire bid package as your response, including the signed cover sheet and your companies W9, with an authorized signature. Responses received without the signature of a bidder’s authorized agent on the cover sheet will be considered a non-responsive offer and will not be considered. Send one original, one copy via USPS to 3600 52nd street, Kenosha, WI 53144 Attn: Purchasing Department or email to PurchasingDepartment@kUSD.edu and Corki Roth at croth@kUSD.edu. It is the responsibility of the bidder to ensure that proposals arrive to the specified location by the deadline for proposal submission. Late proposals may be accepted if it can be ascertained beyond a reasonable doubt that the circumstances, which caused the proposal to be late, were beyond the bidder’s control and that the proposal was submitted without prior knowledge of the contents of competing proposals. The acceptance of late proposals will be at the discretionary authority of the Purchasing Agent.
6. Bidders shall make all investigations necessary to thoroughly inform themselves regarding the delivery of services as required by the solicitation. No plea of ignorance by the bidder of conditions that exist or that may hereafter exist as a result of failure to fulfill the requirements of the contract documents will be accepted as the basis for varying from the requirements of the District or the compensation to the bidder.
7. The opening will take place at the Educational Support Center. 3600 – 52nd St, Kenosha, in **Room 180 on Wednesday, March 18, 2026 at 10:00AM** where they will then be publicly opened. Bidders, or their authorized agents, are invited to be present for the opening; however, no decisions or evaluation will take place – only an acknowledgement of qualifying receipt. 8. All proposals must be signed by an individual authorized to bind the offer to be valid.
9. All proposals must include your companies W9, with an authorized signature.

10. Verbal commitments will NOT be honored.
11. Proposals must be submitted on this form and all information requested must be furnished. Proposals submitted in any other manner, or which fail to furnish all information required, will be rejected. Proposals must be filled out legibly in ink or typewritten.
12. The provider shall not commence work under this agreement until obtaining all insurance required and such insurance has been approved by the District. The provider(s) awarded this proposal must supply the District with proof of insurance prior to the finalization of this agreement.

The Insurance Certificate must contain the following required statement:

“The policy shall cover its facilities and equipment and the acts, omissions and errors of its employees, including allegations of ‘child molestation, providing services under this agreement for limits not less than \$1,000,000 and with an occurrence based policy”

Provider must also agree to hold harmless, defend and indemnify the District, its officers, agents, employees, school board members and volunteer for any and all claims, liability demands, causes of action, damages, costs and attorney fees arising from or incident to the operation, maintenance and use of vehicles including, but not limited to claims of negligence and/or wrongdoing by the Provider, its employees, agents, officers, and board of directors and/or liability arising from equipment failures and deficiencies, except to the extent that any such claim or demand arises from or is caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of the District, its officers, agents or employees, school board members, or volunteers.

A copy of the provider’s insurance policy must accompany this proposal. (Those who have previously submitted policies submit the Certificate of Insurance)

13. KUSD will operate in compliance with Wisconsin Act 76 regarding contract termination as a result of a person convicted of a serious crime.
14. A copy of the Center’s polices/procedures for the following must be attached to the bidder’s proposal:
 - a. Fire Drills
 - b. Tornado drills
 - c. Safety plans
 - d. Building evacuation
 - e. Intruder protocol

I. Contract Agreement

- a. The District may elect to award more than one contract or select multiple vendors as a result of this RFP process.

b. Indemnification

The successful bidder(s) shall assume the entire responsibility and liability to indemnify the Kenosha Unified School District, its elected and appointed officials, employees, volunteers and others working on behalf of the District. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the successful bidder agrees to defend, pay on behalf of, indemnify, and hold harmless the District against any and all claims, demands, suits, damages or losses, together with any and all outlay and expense connected therewith, including but not limited to attorneys' fees and court costs, that may be asserted or claimed against, recovered from or suffered by the District by reason of any injury or loss, including, but not limited to, personal injury, including bodily injury or death, property damage, including loss of use thereof, and economic damages arising out of or in any way connected or associated with any work and/or activities performed by the successful bidder pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement. The successful bidder obligation to indemnify the District contained in this Agreement is not limited by the amount or type of damages, compensation or benefits payable under any workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts.

The District shall not be liable or in any way responsible for any injury, damage, liability, claim, loss or expense incurred by the successful bidder, its officers, employees, subcontractors, and others affiliated with the successful bidder, arising out of or in any way connected or associated with any work and/or activities performed by the bidder pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement, except for and only to the extent caused by the negligence of the District. The successful bidder expressly assumes full responsibility for any and all damages to the District property arising out of or in any way connected or associated with any work and/or activities performed by the successful bidder pursuant to the provisions of this proposal including, but not limited to, the activities of the bidder, its officers, employees, subcontractors, and others affiliated with the bidder.

The successful bidder shall ensure that its activities on the District premises will be performed and supervised by adequately trained and qualified personnel and the bidder will observe, and cause its officers, employees, subcontractors and others affiliated with the bidder to observe all applicable safety rules.

c. Employees and Sub-contractors

- i. The bidder shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of this contract/agreement, including any or all of its right, title or interest therein, or its power to execute such contract/agreement to any person, company or corporation without prior written consent of the District.
- ii. All employees of the bidder shall be considered to be, at all times, employees of the bidder under its sole direction and not an employee or agent of the District. Where required, employees shall be licensed and accredited. The District may require the successful bidder to remove an employee it deems careless, incompetent, insubordinate or otherwise objectionable and whose continued employment on District property is not in the best interest of the District. In accordance with the District's policy regarding the use of tobacco and alcohol products and/or illegal drugs, no employee of the successful bidder shall be permitted to use these substances when performing work on District property.

- iii. The successful bidder(s) shall certify that all employees employed in support of this contract/agreement who have direct contact with students, which is defined to mean being in the presence of students during regular school hours or during school-sponsored activities, have not been convicted of a felony, any offense involving the sexual molestation, physical or sexual abuse of a child, or a crime of moral turpitude.
- iv. The names of all subcontractors known, or contemplated, shall be listed. The District reserves the right to approve all subcontracts.

d. Termination or Cancellation

- i. In order to protect the vested interests of the District, and to ensure the efficient utilization of funds, the successful bidder shall comply with all contractual obligations contained in the General Terms and Conditions, Special Conditions and the Scope of Services. With respect to these obligations, the District will report any non-compliance issues to the successful bidder for corrective action. Continued non-compliance by the successful bidder shall be the District's justification for placing the bidder's contract/agreement on probation status or termination.
- ii. In the event that the successful bidder defaults on its contract/agreement or the contract/agreement is terminated for cause due to performance, the District reserves the right to re-procure the products or services from the next choice bidder or from other sources during the remaining term of the terminated/defaulted contract/agreement.
- iii. In the case of termination, costs shall be prorated to the date of termination and the parties shall execute a settlement agreement to specify the terms. Failure to agree in a settlement may be subject to arbitration.
- iv. With the mutual agreement of both the contractor and the District, upon receipt and acceptance of not less than thirty days written notice, the contract/agreement may be terminated on an agreed date before the end of the contract without penalties to either party.
- v. Either party may terminate the contract/agreement because of the failure of the other party to carry out the provisions of the contract/agreement. In such case, the party terminating the contract shall give thirty days' notice of conditions endangering performance and if after notice the offending party fails to remedy the violation of the terms to the satisfaction of the other party, the contract/agreement may be terminated.
- vi. In the event of the filing of a Petition in Bankruptcy by or against the successful bidder, the District shall have the right to terminate the contract/agreement by providing 15 days' notice of its intentions to terminate.
- vii. If funds anticipated for these products or services do not become available for any reason, the District shall have the right to terminate the contract/agreement without penalty by giving not less than 20 days written notice documenting the lack of funding.

e. Disclosure of Information:

The laws of Wisconsin dictate that at the conclusion of the selection process the contents of the information packages be placed in the public domain and be open for inspection by interested parties. The District will treat all information submitted by a bidder as public information. Bidders are advised that the District does not wish to receive confidential or proprietary information and bidders are not to supply such information except when it is absolutely necessary. Pricing information cannot be considered confidential information. Finally, identification of the entire Bid as confidential will be deemed non-responsive and disqualify the bidder's proposal.

f. Examination and disposition of information

Bidder agrees that any authorized auditor, the Office of Auditor of the State and where federal funds are involved, the Comptroller of the United States or a representative of the United States Government, shall have access to and a right to examine, audit, excerpt, and transcribe any directly pertinent books, documents, papers, and records of the bidder relating to the orders, invoices, or payment of this contract/agreement.

All Bids become the property of the District and will not be returned to the bidder at the conclusion of the selection process; the contents of all Bids will be in the public domain and be open to inspection by interested parties

II. Conflicts of Interest

- a. It shall be understood and agreed that submitted bid proposals are offered independently of any other proposals.
- b. In the event that an independent contractor or firm in conjunction with the district developed this RFP, neither this contractor, nor its principals or subsidiaries, shall be allowed to submit a bid for this solicitation.
- c. In the event that this RFP requires consulting services which may ultimately lead to the purchase or other products or services in the future, neither the selected consultant, nor its principals or subsidiaries, will be allowed to participate in the acquisition of these specific goods and services in the future.
- d. Wisconsin Statute 19.59 prohibits a person serving in a public capacity from obtaining anything of value that could reasonably be expected to influence the person's vote, official actions of judgment, or could reasonably be considered as a reward for any official action of inaction on the part of the individual.

III. Economic Adjustments

Pricing shall be firm for the life of the contract or agreement. There is no limitation on the amount of price decreases that may be made under this clause.

IV. Incurring Costs

Kenosha Unified School District is not liable for any costs incurred in replying to this RFP.

V. Method of Bid

Bids written in pencil will be rejected. Erasures or corrections of mistakes on Request for Proposal must be initialed or signed by bidder. Failure to meet any requirements listed in this bid document may be cause for disqualification of the bid.

Submitted bids must include the signature page, and acknowledgement of addenda if any. A legally authorized representative of the bidder will sign the Certification of Bidder signature page in ink.

Any information held to be proprietary by a bidder must be plainly marked as such and may not include pricing.

If the bidder cannot meet a requirement the term "No Bid" must be entered for that item. An alternative equivalent service can be proposed in the form of an attachment labeled "Alternate".

VI. Number of Bids Required

XI. Amendments to Bids

Each bidder will be allowed a period of forty-eight (48) hours after the time and date set for receipt of bids to notify Kenosha Unified School District’s Purchasing Department in writing of a material mistake in the bid. Failure of bidder to notify Kenosha Unified School District’s Purchasing Department in the manner and within the time limit specified above will constitute a waiver by the bidder of all rights and remedies relative to a material mistake. Formal bid amendments thereto, or requests for withdrawal of bid received by Kenosha Unified School District’s Purchasing Department after time specified for opening will not be considered.
