

Scholarship Information

There are many places to apply for scholarships and there are scholarships of all kinds. Please keep in mind that in order for any student to accept financial aid or scholarships, you MUST have completed the Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA). Here are three main resources you should look for scholarships:

2. Check with the college or university you are applying to. Each individual school has their own set of scholarships they give to incoming freshman. Some of them are automatic and others you apply for. You can visit the website for your prospective school and find the tab that leads you to their scholarships.
3. Web based search engines. There are a lot of scholarship search engines that can be used to find scholarships. The pool of applicants is usually large, so your chances may be smaller than local scholarships or scholarships offered by the college/university, but you can always apply.

It is important to note that you should NOT have to pay money to apply for scholarships. If they require a fee, it is advisable to not apply, or to at least research the company/organization first.
